Who is on the teams?

Each team will consist of design and construction professionals; City College students studying Architecture, Construction Management, and Interior Design; City College alumni; and local high school students.

What will they build?

Teams will create a structure whose design reflects aspects of specific neighborhoods in San Francisco, building upon the rich cultural, social, ethnic, and diverse populations of this great city.

How will they build it?

Each construction team will use:

- 1) A pre-designed “Kit of Parts” by the Architecture Department; and
- 2) A neighborhood “Kit of Parts” that is assembled by the team

Where and when will they build it?

On Friday, April 25, 2008 in Justin Herman Plaza from 9 am until 3 pm.

How will teams be judged?

Professionals and community members will judge and award prizes to teams that distinguish themselves through the design and construction of the structures.

At the end of the competition, these neighborhood sculptures will stand in Justin Herman Plaza as tributes to the diverse traditions and peoples of San Francisco—as well as to the natural and rich synergy the Architecture Department enjoys with the people of San Francisco.

What’s the point of the Archistructerior event?

- To celebrate the 60th Anniversary of the Architecture Department and make known community-wide its goals and mission
- To build bridges with vested professionals and firms in the fields of architecture, construction management, and interior design
- To build a community support network for the Department and raise funds to benefit its students

And, ultimately, to ensure students have every opportunity to succeed, be equipped with skills and knowledge for the workforce, and continue their educational pursuits!

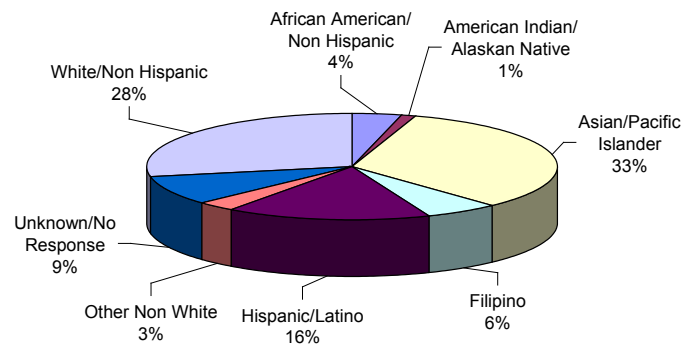

Major grants

City College of San Francisco is partnering on a \$4.2 million grant from Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation to expand career training for nurses. California's first technical certificate to equip students with the latest in stem cell research techniques is being funded by a \$780,000 grant from the Governor's Office. It will provide students with the scientific background and laboratory experience needed to find jobs in this emerging field.

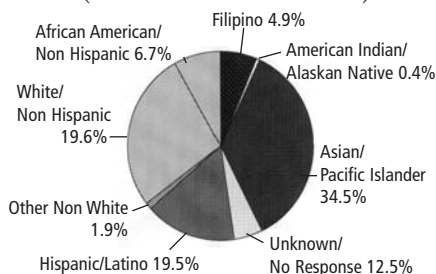
Facilities Update

City College has recently completed new buildings for the Student Health Center, Health and Wellness Center, the Orfalea Family Center and a new Mission Campus. The College has purchased a new site for the Chinatown/North Beach Campus. All of the above are funded by Prop. A, the \$195 million general obligation bond issue approved by voters in 2001. On Nov. 5, 2005, voters approved Phase II authorizing \$246.3 million in general obligation bonds to fund a major overhaul of CCSF's campuses as well as construction of new facilities.

Quality Programs

City College of San Francisco (CCSF) offers courses in more than 50 academic programs and over 100 occupational disciplines (see reverse side). There is a full range of credit courses leading to the Associate of Arts and Science degrees, most of which meet the general education requirements of four-year colleges and universities. Occupational courses and programs prepare students for immediate employment. Free noncredit courses such as English as a Second Language and Citizenship, as well as classes designed for Older Adults, are also available. Competitively priced, short-term community service courses meet the training needs of business, industry and government, and personal enrichment of community members.

Neighborhood Locations

The main campus is at Phelan and Ocean Avenues. Other campuses are: **Alemany**, 750 Eddy St.; **Chinatown/North Beach**, 940 Filbert St.; **Downtown**, 88 Fourth St.; **John Adams**, 1860 Hayes St. & 1351 Haight St.; **Evans**, 1400 Evans Ave.; **Mission**, 1125 Valencia St.; **Southeast**, 1800 Oakdale Ave.; **Castro-Valencia**, 1220 Noe St.; and **SF International Airport (Bldg. 928)**. **Ft. Mason Art Center**, Laguna St. and Marina Blvd., and the **Adult Learning & Tutorial Center**, 31 Gough St., also are part of CCSF's more than 100 community instructional sites located around San Francisco.

Faculty Make The Difference

CCSF employs 728 full-time and 1,371 part-time faculty, 95 percent of whom have master's degrees, with nearly 250 holding doctorates. They teach approximately 100,000 credit and noncredit students annually.

Outstanding Staff

CCSF has 53 administrators and 917 classified employees to operate one of the largest community college systems in the nation.

Tremendous Value

At just **\$20.00 per unit** for California residents, including those holding a bachelor's or higher degree, California's community colleges are still the best value in higher education. Noncredit courses are free.

Transfer Articulation Agreements (TAA)

The TAA assures students a place for a specified semester at University of California system, San Francisco State, and a host of other four-year colleges and universities. Students must, with the assistance of their Counselors, complete TAA applications and the specified course requirements with an agreed-upon grade point average.
